Community is at the heart of Denman Prospect and there has been a strong focus on creating functional amenities for people to gather and grow, including parks and playgrounds, Denman Village Shops, and the Denman Village Community Centre.

Denman Prospect takes its name from Lady Denman, the wife of the fifth Governor-General of Australia.

DENMAN VILLAGE COMMUNITY CENTRE

The Denman Village Community Centre is the first purpose-built facility for use by community organisations in the Molonglo Valley. The Centre is operated by Communities at Work and includes various sized function rooms and access to facilities including kitchenettes and AV equipment. The Centre operates with an electronic kiosk that enables easy check-in for visitors and guests to attend pre-booked events and meetings. All visitors must check in via the electronic kiosk upon entry.

The Denman Village Community Centre hosts two Communities at Work Program areas: Community Development and the Centre of Professional Learning and Education.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Our Community Development team partners with local communities, government, individuals, and businesses to help develop and implement initiatives that build and strengthen community connections. Through these partnerships, we strive to uncover inclusive, collaborative, and ongoing opportunities, that empower and build resilience as foundations of growth. The Community Development team office is located upstairs and welcome your visit.

THE CENTRE OF PROFESSIONAL LEARNING AND EDUCATION

Our Centre of Professional Learning and Education (CPLE) is a registered training organisation (RTO 88148) in Canberra, offering nationally recognised qualifications in Early Childhood Education and Care, and Business Administration. We also provide professional development training workshops. The CPLE team office is located upstairs and classes are held in the Winanggaay room.

BUGANG

[bu-gung] • Bogong Moth

66 pax | 132m²

- Projector and screen

Summer in Ngunnawal country brings millions of Bogong moths to the high country, where they can be found hiding in rocky crevices to survive the warmer weather. The moths are very nutritious, rich in stored fats and oils, and high in protein. The moths were shaken and teased out from under rocky overhangs into nets and then roasted on a fire. Some were smoked and stored as cakes for use in more difficult times.



MOLONGLO I & MOLONGLO II

[mo-lon-glo] • Molonglo River

The Molonglo I and Molonglo II rooms are divided by a retractable wall, so that both rooms can be combined if a larger function space is required.

Denman Prospect is located in the Molonglo Valley surrounding the Molonglo River. Waterholes and river systems hold a deep spiritual connection to the Ngunnawal peoples and many other Aboriginal peoples. Aboriginal people travelled great distances across country often using the waterholes as places to refresh. In Ngunnawal country, they followed river corridors including the Shoalhaven, Murrumbidgee, Molonglo and other rivers. The river corridors provided a wide variety of flora and fauna as a readily available food source.

NAMARAG

[num-arug] • Wattle

Ngunnawal peoples and other Aboriginal peoples use acacias such as Wattle for a wide range of purposes, from medicine to the raw material used to create dyes, clap sticks and other instruments. In Ngunnawal country, the flowering of the Wattle also marked the arrival of Bogong moths to the region. Wattle is also our Nation's floral emblem and grows profusely in the Molonglo Valley.



WINANGGAY

[win-an-gay] • Learning

15 pax | 32m²

This room is suitable for small meetings, tutoring or workshops. The room has ample power points and includes a whiteboard. For larger multi-room bookings, Winanggaay may double up as a break-out room.





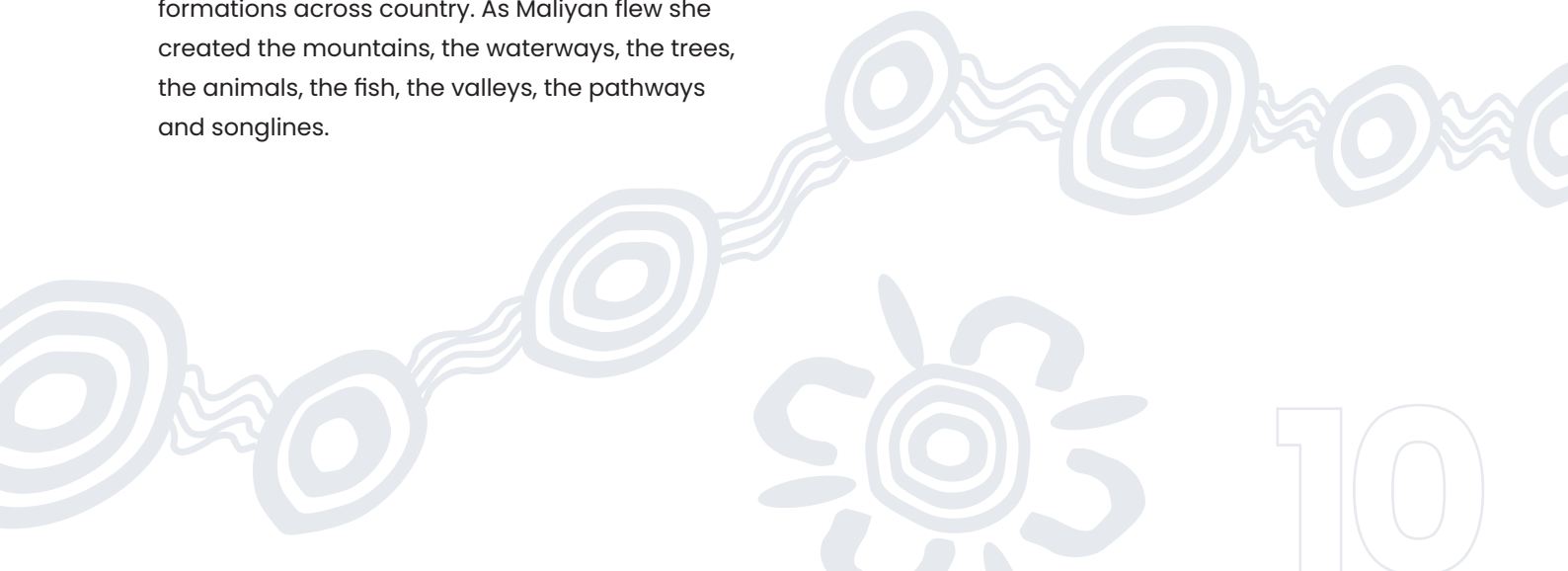
MALIYAN

[mali-yun] • Wedgetail Eagle

The Maliyan (Wedgetail Eagle) is Australia's largest bird of prey, and a significant Ngunnawal country totem. The Maliyan is also a creator spirit in a dreamtime story. Maliyan flew across Ngunnawal country spreading her wings and laying her eggs which are the large rock formations across country. As Maliyan flew she created the mountains, the waterways, the trees, the animals, the fish, the valleys, the pathways and songlines.

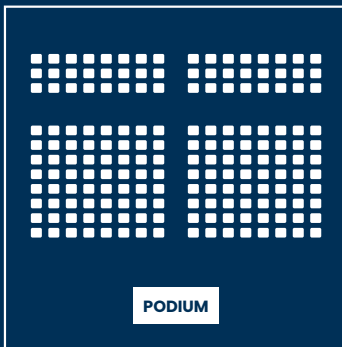

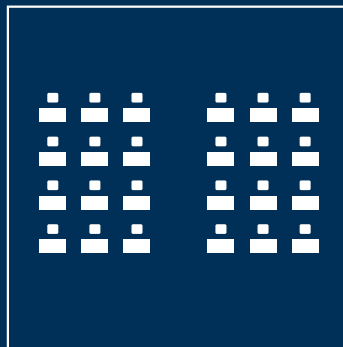

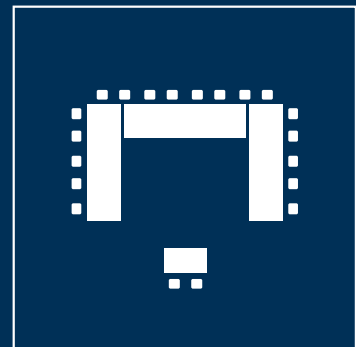
THEATRE LAYOUT



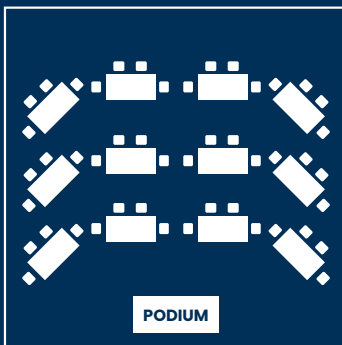
SCHOOL LAYOUT



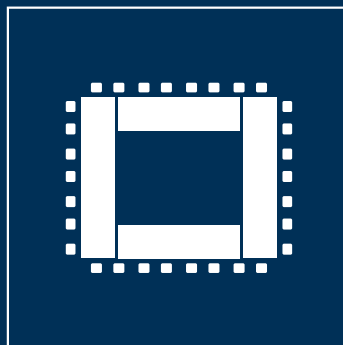
U-SHAPE



CABARET LAYOUT

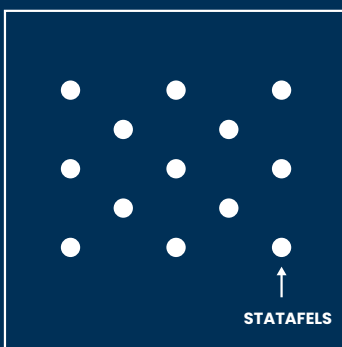


SQUARE LAYOUT

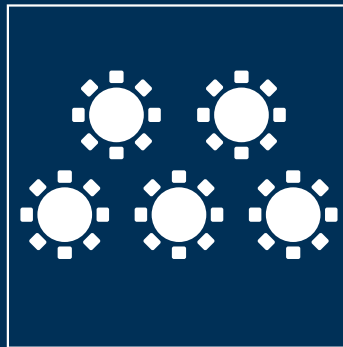

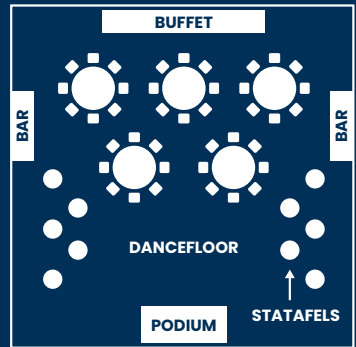

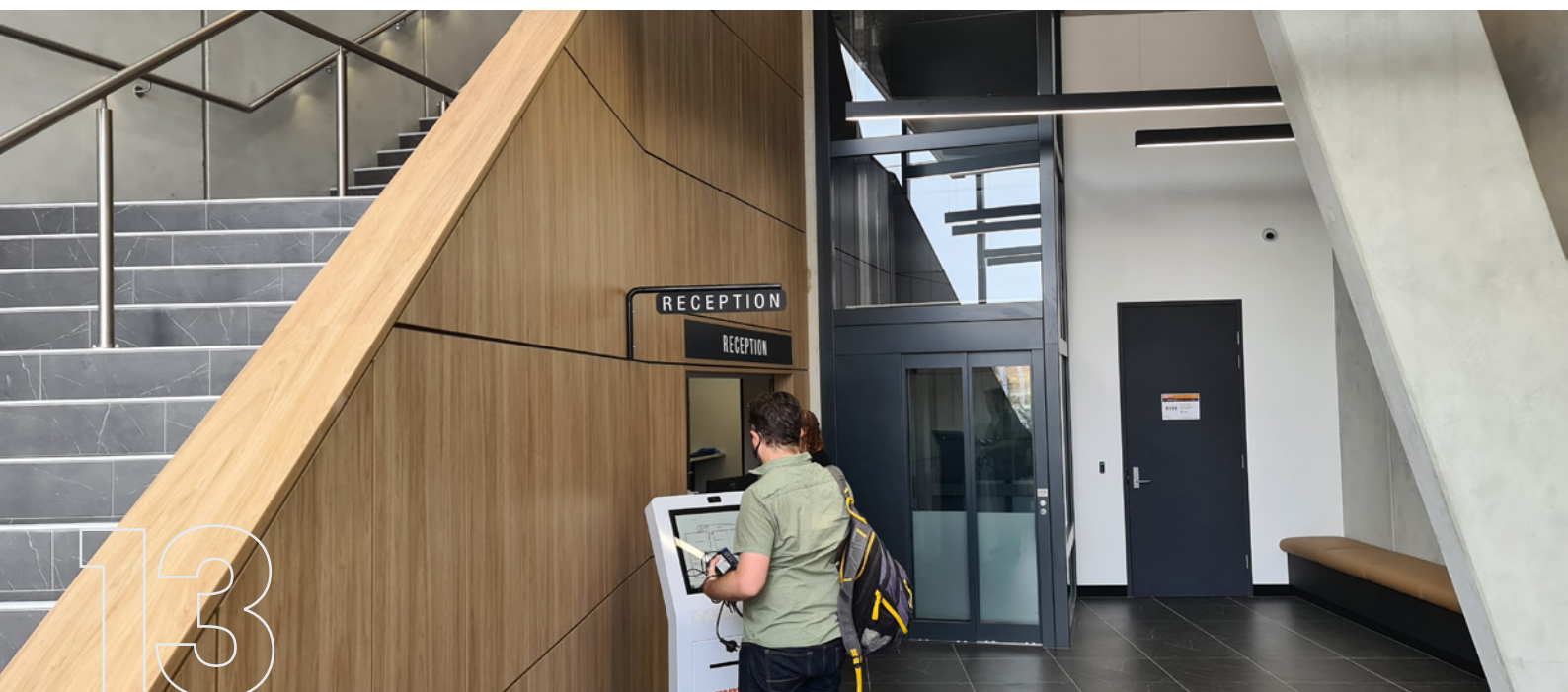
All rooms are available for hire seven days a week, during the day and in the evening. Priority is given to community groups, not-for-profit organisations or groups providing activities open to the general public.
